KEVIN ARTER

My daughter, Sarah Kimmerling, and wife Chris are both active in the church. I also have two other children, now adults, and one grandson. We have been active in the church since 2010. Prior to that, I had occasional contact with the church since the mid 1990s. We usually attend the 9:00am Sunday service. I am involved with St. Cuthbert's men's brewing group and small group studies. I am part of Holy Trinity because it is focused on the Bible and on teaching. As a member of the Vestry, my talents align best with helping to manage the operations of the church to ensure that it can meet the needs of the congregation and the community. 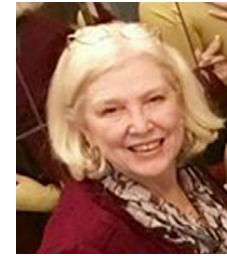
